On page 2 I've attached a template (not that you need it). Let the children colour them in, or stick and glue tissue paper on them or even better use lollipop sticks to strengthen them.

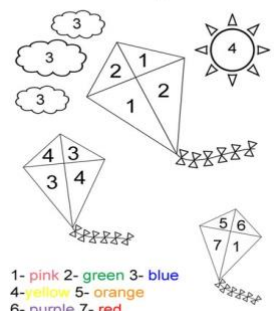
